

Objects of the Association (AIDS Care Education and Training Jersey)

- 4.1. The objects of the Association are for the benefit of the public and as an expression of Christian faith and service (a) the provision and promotion of education and other measures which will assist in the prevention of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome and (b) the relief of need, sickness and distress of persons suffering from the said syndrome in any part of the world and (c) for such charitable purposes ancillary to the said objects as the Trustees may determine.

The term Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome shall include what is currently known as acquired immunodeficiency syndrome and related or similar or associated conditions including the earliest stages of infection or illness.

- 4.2. The furtherance of the above objects, but not further or otherwise the Association shall have the following powers.
- 4.2.1. To provide or promote without regard to race, colour, creed or lifestyle the provision of care, practical help, support and counselling for those suffering from the Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome and their families and friends.
- 4.2.2. To collect, disseminate, and analyse information and statistics related to the Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome.
- 4.2.3. To write, print, publish, issue and circulate gratuitously or otherwise any reports, periodicals, books, newspapers, broadcasting, films, pamphlets, leaflets, other documents and all other media of information.
- 4.2.4. To take all such steps as may from time to time be reasonably necessary for the purpose of promoting the objects of the Association or procuring contributions by way of donations, subscriptions, devises, bequests or in any other manner to the funds of the Association.
- 4.2.5. To establish and acquire and hold shares in commercial trading or investment companies with a view to their realising profits for use in connection with the Association's objects.
- 4.2.6. To undertake and execute any charitable trusts which may be lawfully undertaken by the Association.
- 4.2.7. To raise funds and receive contributions from any person or persons whatsoever by way of subscriptions donations and otherwise provided that the Association shall not undertake any permanent trading activities in raising funds for its primary purpose.
- 4.2.8. To establish and support or aid in the establishment and support of any charitable association or institution, trust or fund, and to subscribe or guarantee money for charitable purpose, calculated to promote the Association's objects or any of them.
- 4.2.9. To establish, make provision for or assist in making provision for professorships, readerships, scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, prizes, salaries, and grants for persons or charitable institutions engaged in teaching or research relating to the objects of the Association of such amounts and upon such terms and conditions as the Association shall think fit.
- 4.2.10. To arrange hold and provide for or join in arranging, holding and providing for lectures, exhibitions, meetings, classes, conferences and other things reasonably necessary for the advancement of the objects of the Association.
- 4.2.11. To enter into and carry into effect agreements or arrangements with associations, institutions, companies or individuals which are reasonably necessary for the attainment or furtherance of the Association's objects or any of them.

- 4.2.12. To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property or any estate or interest whatsoever and in any rights privileges and servitudes over or in respect of any property which may be considered necessary for the purposes of the Association.
- 4.2.13. To sell, manage, lease, mortgage, exchange, dispose of or otherwise deal with and turn to account all or any part of the property of the Association with a view to the promotion of its objects or any of them.
- 4.2.14. To borrow and raise money in such manner as may be considered necessary and for the purpose of securing any debt or other obligation of the Association to mortgage or charge all or any part of the property of the Association subject as hereinafter provided.
- 4.2.15. To invest and deal with any monies of the Association not immediately required for use in connection with any of its objects in the purchase of or at interest upon the security of such stocks, funds, shares, securities units in a unit trust or other investments or property movable or immovable or of whatsoever nature and situated anywhere in the world, and whether involving liability or not, and whether in possession or reversion.
- 4.2.16. To undertake or support research the result of which may assist in the furtherance of the objectives.
- 4.2.17. To do all such other lawful things as shall further the foregoing objects or any of them.

Members

13. The Members shall (until death or resignation) be the Subscribers to the Constitution together with those the Board shall in future admit to Membership.

PROVIDED THAT

- (a) All applications for membership shall be conditional upon the applicant concerned signing and sending to the Secretary an application for admission framed in the following terms:-
